Dear Parents & Carers

We have been informed that on Tuesday of this week there was an incident involving two students from St Laurence School. They were approached by a car containing two adults as they walked home around 3.15pm along Winsley Road, just along from the Rising Sun pub. The female passenger tried to encourage the students to get into the car. The students did exactly the right thing and said no and left the area as quickly as possible.

The incident has been reported to the police who are investigating and there will be an increased marked police patrol presence around the area for the next few days after school.

Children at Churchfields have today been reminded about the importance of safe behaviour such as never accepting lifts from strangers and reporting such incidents to adults.

Trip to LEGOLAND FRIDAY 17th MARCH 2017

Further to the letter in January about the forthcoming Churchfields Science Week I am pleased to provide final details of our annual, whole school day trip, this year, to LEGOLAND. The travel costs have been met by our wonderful P.T.A. As well as being able to tour the various Lego structures and 4 to 11-year-old appropriate attractions each class will participate in a science/technology workshop.

Details of the trip are:

- Children will need to be in school for 8:25am registration at Atworth and 8:10am at Monkton Farleigh. Coaches will leave both bases straight after registration, so it is essential that the children are at school in plenty of time that day and that we keep the surrounding roads at both bases free of as many parked cars as possible.
- It will be a longer day returning to school by around 6pm. (leaving LEGOLAND at 4:30pm)
- Children will need to bring snacks plus a packed lunch and drinks in a backpack they will carry themselves. Children in receipt of Free School Meals will have a lunch provided for them (please note: this is not the same as Universal Free School Meals which are provided to all Reception and KS1 – if you are unsure please ask in the office or speak to your child's class teacher).
- Children can wear casual, comfy trousers but must wear their school sweatshirt, sensible shoes or trainers and bring a waterproof coat.
- Children will have restricted access to some of the attractions due to their age, height or the strict LEGOLAND child to teacher ratios, and weather conditions (for instance it will be too cold to get soaked on water rides)
- No spending money will be required.
- We have telephone contact and medical information held within school. However, if any of this has changed recently, please contact and update the school office. Please hand any medication to us in a named bag on the day. We would be grateful if parents could advise us if anyone other than you will be picking your children up at the end of the trip.

In order for the trip to go ahead we kindly request a voluntary contribution of £9.75 per child to cover remaining admission and workshop costs. Unfortunately, if we do not receive sufficient voluntary contributions, the trip will be cancelled.

Please complete and return the slip below with your voluntary contribution by Friday 3rd March. You will be able to use our new ParentPay system for this. Thank you for your support. We are all looking forward to a fantastic trip!

PARKING OUTSIDE SCHOOL

ADVICE NOTE ISSUED JOINTLY BY

THE POLICE & HIGHWAYS AUTHORITY AND CHURCHFIELDS, THE VILLAGE SCHOOL

The Governors and Teachers at the school have expressed concern over the situation created at the school by parents parking when they bring/collect their children to/from school.

Rule 217 of the Highway Code states: **THINK** before you park. **DO NOT** park your vehicle where it would endanger, inconvenience or obstruct pedestrians or other road users. For example **DO NOT PARK:**

- Near a school entrance
- Anywhere you would prevent access for Emergency Services
- At or near a bus stop or taxi rank
- Opposite or within 10 metres (32 feet) of a junction, except in an authorised parking space
- Near the brow of a hill
- Opposite a traffic island or (if this would cause an obstruction) another parked vehicle
- Partially or wholly on the pavement unless signs permit it. Parking on the pavement can obstruct and seriously inconvenience pedestrians, people in wheelchairs, the visually impaired and people with prams or pushchairs.
- In front of the entrance to a property
- On a bend

It is also **ILLEGAL** to park or wait on a double yellow line or single yellow line (during the hours specified on the signs). This may result in **ENFORCEMENT** action being taken.

You are therefore advised to park **LEGALLY**, away from the school entrance for the **SAFETY** of all concerned.

As parents you have a duty to park **SENSIBLY** and keep the school entrance clear to ensure that there is the best possible visibility for and of children who cross the road at the school. You are reminded of your possible liability should an accident occur.

If you can reduce the congestion by walking so much the better. The School Travel Plan sets out how the school aims to reduce car journeys to the school site and promotes sustainable alternatives such as walking, cycling and car share.



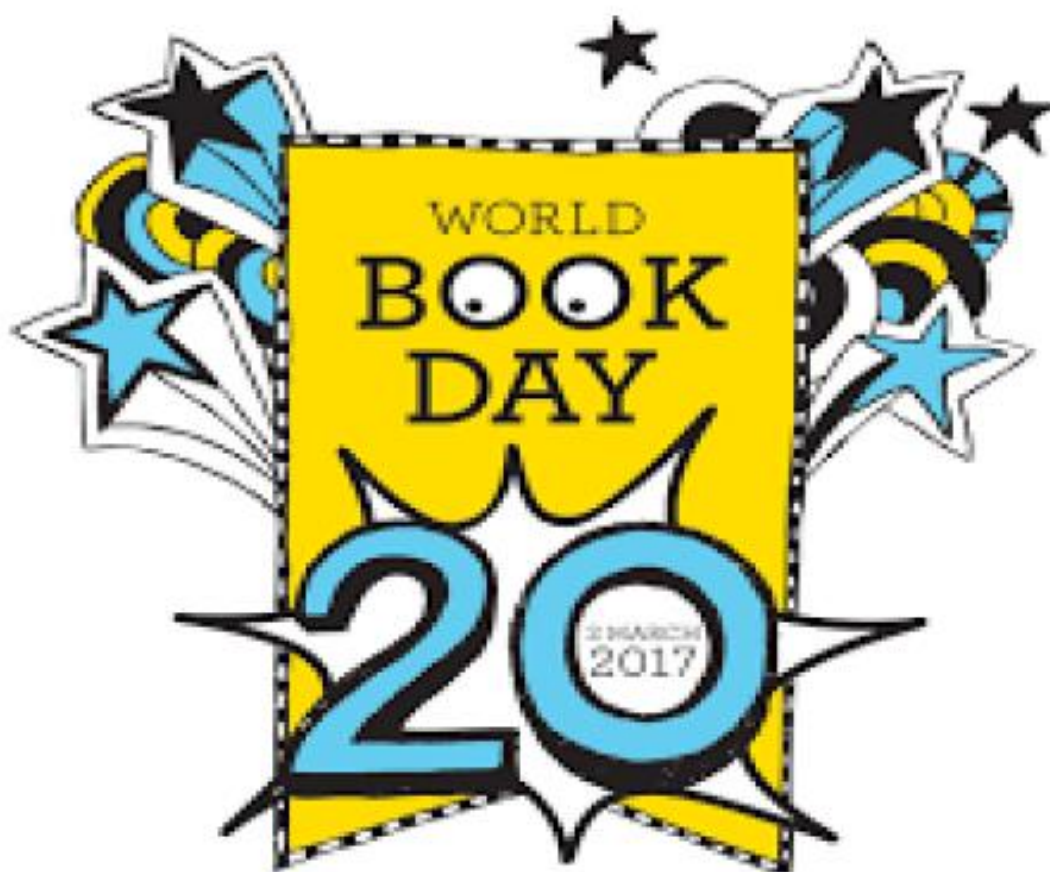
