

Pen Recycling Collection.

In an effort to reduce, reuse and recycle we will have a pen recycling collection point at each base after half term. Any


plastic pens can be recycled and Mrs Liddiard will be coordinating delivery to a collection point. The pens are then up-cycled by Terracycle into plastic pellets which are then made into planters, picnic tables, benches, watering cans etc.

Look out for the collection boxes in the reception areas at each base after half term.

Accepted waste in this programme:

All writing instruments (except for wooden pencils and chalk) are accepted: Any brand of pen, felt tip, highlighter, marker, correction fluid pot, correction tape, mechanical pencil and eraser pen regardless of their composition.

Note that we **do not** accept glue sticks, erasers, rulers or other cutting objects that could disturb the recycling process. Please be careful not to include any of those items.

THIS IS SOMETIMES MIGRE CHALLENGING ONLINE RECAUSE WE CANNOT SEE THE PERSON, CONNECT WITH HOW THEY FEEL NOR INTERACT FACE TO FACE.
