School Health Support Worker (SHSW) delivery of School Nursing Service

SHSW were unable to complete the Year R hearing and vision screening as a result of Covid-19. As of yet, SHSW have not had confirmation from Public Health England (PHE) regarding the plans to review this cohort. If your child is currently in year 1 and you have any concerns regarding your child's vision or hearing please let us know so we can give you details of how to make contact with the Duty School Nurse. It is recommended by SHSW that all children should have an annual optician check with a local optician and if there are any concerns about their child's hearing, then to visit their GP.

School transport and face coverings

Where your son / daughter can, they should wear a face covering if they are over 11 years old whist on school transport. There is no requirement for primary aged pupils or children who are exempt to wear one, although it is strongly recommended. If travelling by public bus a face covering must be worn if your son / daughter is over 11 years old.

It is the responsibility of the parents and students to make sure they wear a face covering. Drivers are not responsible for enforcing face coverings, neither are we encouraging them to challenge students.
