HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

Dear Parent/Carer,

As this extraordinary term draws to a close, I would again like to offer my immense thanks to the school community for displaying incredible resilience at such a challenging time. Everyone continues to have their own stressors to deal with as we mark the passing of a year living in the shadow of COVID-19 - pupils, parents, carers, staff and governors included. Despite this, the whole community has pulled together to put the well-being of Churchfields' pupils first, and it shows. We are constantly amazed at the resilience of children, and how readily they have adapted to the evolving pandemic. They also continue to work hard to apply themselves to home learning or being in school without many of their friends. We all recognise how emotionally draining this must all be for them in both circumstances. Many parents and carers will continue to work over the upcoming half term as well as care for their children at a time when severe restrictions are still in place for our safety. I do hope you and your children are able to have some downtime without supporting remote learning adding to these pressures. I am sure you will also join me in thanking staff for their hard work balancing remote education with their commitments in school, or supporting the school community in other ways. They have worked tirelessly to ensure children's educational opportunities and experiences have been the best they can be at this unprecedented time.

As discussed last week, schools have been asked to support contact tracing over the upcoming half term break. This means that parents should report the following positive COVID-19 result to me at head@churchfields.wilts.sch.uk if 1) their child tests positive within 48 hours of them last attending school OR 2) their child develops COVID-19 symptoms within 48 hours of them last attending school then subsequently tests positive. If neither of these conditions apply, parents should inform the school about any positive result within their household after the half term break. The main symptoms of COVID-19 are a high temperature, a new, continuous cough or/and a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste. If you have any of these symptoms, get a test to check if you have Coronavirus, and stay at home until you get your result.

School will return in its current form on **Monday 22nd February**. We have been assured that no changes will be made to school opening rules during the break.
