Restore Records Management are a national company with a document storage facility in the old MoD mine network under Monkton Farleigh. Click here to visit their website. They ran a series of six tours over the summer, showing people around the huge network of tunnels originally excavated to supply the distinctive stone to the city of Bath, and later taken over by the military as a weapons store in World War Two. John Davis, a local Monkton Farleigh villager and avid cave enthusiast, kindly organised for Churchfields, Monkton Farleigh to receive donations totalling £690 by visitors to the site so a massive thank you to him for his support. Restore Records Management then matched that amount leading to a grand total donation of £1380! Churchfields is incredibly grateful as this funding will make a real difference to our pupils.
