As a school we believe in working in partnership with pupils, parents, and carers to provide the best environment we can, allowing the children in our care to thrive. If you have any questions on how you can help support us to do that, or if you have any concerns, please do raise them with the class teacher – they would be more than happy to arrange a time to speak with you.

As we head into the winter months our dedicated Friends of Churchfields Volunteers (formally the PTA) will be putting on a host of amazing different fundraising events. Do please try and support them with your time or donations if you can. The money raised is essential in supporting our Wow! Days and other enriching events, which greatly benefit both the children's learning and well-being.

I want to extend a huge thank you again from all the governors to those volunteers who give up their precious time to make these vital fundraising events happen. We'd also like to give a special mention to Emma Bennett who as well as being an active member of the FOCS and Pool Committee, she is also working for the school in an official capacity as a fundraiser. She's done an amazing job so far, so thank you Emma!

Churchfields Governing Board held its first Full Governors meeting of the academic year in September, which is where we elected the board and committee chairs and set our objectives for the next 12 months. I've been re-elected to continue as Chair of Governors for this coming year with the support of Emily Cadwallader as our Vice-Chair. We are very grateful that David Pritchard has agreed to chair the management committee for another year, a role he's been exceptional at. We are also pleased to welcome Suzanne Gray to the board as Chair of the Educational Standards Committee. She's a valuable new addition to the team, bringing with her a wealth of teaching experience.

To give you all an update on our academy status. The formal application to join Palladian Academy Trust has now been submitted to the Department for Education. We are hoping the application will be considered by the Regional Directors' Office at their December meeting. Should we get their support, we'll then be assigned a case worker who will guide us through the legal process of moving from the Local Authority into the Academy Trust.

We've been very impressed by Palladian so far. Even though we are some months away from joining, they have taken the approach that as far as they are concerned, we're already part of the family, so we have already been invited along to their training events and meetings.

I attended the Palladian Chairs Network meeting in September, where representatives from each of the school's Local Governing Committees get together to see how they can work together and share best practice. It's a great introduction to one of the many benefits we'll get working within a supportive group of similar schools.

If you'd like to find out more about our Governing Board, there is a <u>dedicated section</u> on the Churchfields website where you'll find out about what else we do and who we are. We currently have a few vacancies on our board. So, if you have an interest in how the school operates, and a desire to support the school in providing the best possible education it can for all our children, I encourage you to apply.

There are no specific skills required, as training is provided free of charge, but we're always on the lookout for anyone who has expertise they can offer in finance, marketing, PR, human resources, IT, law, and project management. If this sounds like you, please do get in touch with me and I can discuss what's involved. It really is a very rewarding way to volunteer your time and give much needed support to the school.
