
KS2 marked Safer Internet Day by joining in with a live assembly. Evelyn and Heidi summarise what they learnt:

Today we watched a live lesson from CBBC all about internet safety and AI (artificial intelligence). Artificial means made by humans and intelligence means to learn. We use AI a lot more than we think our day to day lives: facial recognition, predictive texts, smart speakers and lots more.

On the other hand, AI can have its very own risks and dangers - deepfake videos and photos which are used to spread misinformation to people. There are lots of ways to recognise these problems: look at the account to see if the person actually has the app or look for clues in the lighting/colour.

AI is not going to take over the world as AI can only do what humans ask it to do. As long as humans use it responsibly then nothing bad could happen.
